GM Corner

First off, let me apologize for the issues with watering around the park. Due to a lack of communication we didn't shift from the one-a-week schedule we were on during the wet parts of may to the multiple-times a week we needed to be on for the hotter weather we experienced at the end of May fast enough. Those changes were made several weeks ago and any current watering issues are due to line breaks or backflow issues. There have been a significant number of those and with the loss of our lead irrigation tech we simply couldn't fix things fast enough. We have brought in contractor help to get everything fixed as fast as possible, so if your corner of the park has issues, we'll get to it as soon as we can.

In the good news department, the part for the boat is in, and we will start training the volunteer oerating crew as soon as possible. We are down to one board, and that one is old and requires a lot

of maintenance. I have identified a replacement, and we plan to order one as soon as we have funds available.

The one area we don't have a good fix for is those fingers of the lake on Captain's Island. The best option so far is volunteer help, Mary Wilson has agreed to take on that program, as well as helping us with other park that need gardening and botanical help.

I also want to thank all those volunteers who have stepped up to help us manage this place we live in. Wil Pineda has almost single-handedly kept the lake monitoring effort going. Joyce McMullen is again taking on the management of the Stansbury Days Event, and Greg and Meg Payeur have taken charge of the Christmas Event and are assisting with vendors for Stansbury Days. Wendy Chin Johansen has been instrumental in advertising other events, pitching in whenever needed. I'm sure I'm missing someone, but thank you to everyone who is helping and to those who've recently come forward to offer help. We recognize that this year would be the most difficult while we wait for the tax increase to take effect, and anything we can do to offset costs will help us get back on a solid financial footing faster.

THIS APPLIES TO GOLF CARTS AND WILL SOON BE ENFORCED IN STANSBURY PARK

41-6a-1115 Motor assisted scooters

- (1)(a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a motor assisted scooter is subject to the provisions under this chapter [Ch. 41-6a] for a bicycle, moped, or a motor-driven cycle.
- (b) For a person operating a motor assisted scooter, the following provisions do not apply:
- (i) seating positions under Section 41-6a-1501;
- (ii) required lights, horns, and mirrors under Section 41-6a-1506;
- (iii) entitlement to full use of a lane under Subsection 41-6a-1502(1); and
- (iv) driver licensing requirements under Section 53-3-202.
- (2) A person under 15 years of age may not operate a motor assisted scooter using the motor unless the person is under the direct supervision of the person's parent or guardian.
- (3) A person under eight years of age may not operate a motor assisted scooter with the motor running on any public property, highway, path, or sidewalk.
- (4) A person may not operate a motor assisted scooter:
- (a) in a public parking structure;
- (b) on public property posted as an area prohibiting skateboards;
- (c) on a highway consisting of a total of four or more lanes designated for regular vehicular traffic:
- (d) on a highway with a posted speed limit greater than 25 miles per hour;
- (e) while carrying more persons at one time than the number for which it is designed; or
- (f) that has been structurally or mechanically altered from the original manufacturer's design.
- (5) Except where posted or prohibited by local ordinance, a motor assisted scooter is considered a nonmotorized vehicle if it is being used with the motor turned off.
- (6) An owner may not authorize or knowingly permit a person to operate a motor assisted scooter in violation of this section.
- (7) A person who violates this section is guilty of a class C misdemeanor.

If your child is stopped driving a golf cart in violation of this code they will be cited.

According to the Tooele County Attorney's office "direct supervision" means you are in the golf cart with them.
