Message From the GM, James Hanzelka

This time of year, we begin transitioning to winter. The pool is closed for winterization. We will use

this process to assess necessary repairs and maintenance to be operational for spring, as well as what needs to happen in future years due to the age and condition of the pool.

The shoreline project, in partnership with Tooele County and the Utah Outdoor Recreation Division of the Department of Natural Resources, should be completed this month. The project goal was to add amenities around the lake. The last phase is the installation of a fixed dock by the clubhouse. We will also be refurbishing the swim platform and fishing dock by the clubhouse. The new process we will be using should make the dock and platform more stable and reduce the risk of damage. If there is continued abuse of the amenities, we will permanently remove them.

There was a serious incident of vandalism that targeted a young individual in the community. Because of the personal nature of the graffiti, it was clearly someone from within the community. We also installed new windows in the clubhouse to

reduce water leakage. Within two weeks of completing that work, someone damaged one of the windows, which we suspect was done by hitting it with a golf ball or some other hard object. This will cost additional money for repairs.

We did catch some individuals who intentionally damaged golf carts. As a consequence of their actions, we are developing a plan for restitution and community service, enabling them to reinvest in the community. We are also increasing camera coverage in and around the clubhouse to enable us to identify individuals acting irresponsibly and address the behavior accordingly.

The playground upgrades are almost complete. There was a delay in the installation at Woodland Park, caused by a change in the contract that required a pour and play surface to be applied to the entire playground. Sagers has a slide that is no longer manufactured. The design has been adapted to accommodate the installation of a different slide. An additional one will also be installed. Both playgrounds should be done this fall.

We hope that you have a safe and happy fall!

END OF SUMMER PROJECT UPDATES

- -Woodland Park All-Ability Playground: Woodland Park's all-ability playground is still under construction! This new play area will include a full playground on specialized rubber surfacing, as well as a swing set on woodchips. The schedule is likely to extend out about five more weeks for the new rubber surfacing installation.
- -<u>Sagers, Parkview, Ponderosa, Gateway, & Village Playgrounds</u>: These 5 playgrounds are also still under construction. Due to changes that had to be made to certain equipment, the goal is to complete these fixes by mid-October.
- -Stansbury Lake Clubhouse Dock: The permanent dock on Stansbury Lake will include ADA access, as well as a viewing area for residents and guests to enjoy the lake up close. This will not be a fishing area, but a common place for pedestrians to view the lake. The dock is still under construction, which should be completed by early October.
- -<u>Security Cameras</u>: There have been 16 security cameras installed at the clubhouse, with additional cameras to be installed at the pool, golf pro shop, maintenance buildings, and various parks. The security camera installation will continue to expand until all SSA common areas have an acceptable level of security.
- -<u>Maintenance Shop Roof Repair</u>: The Parks & Recreation department maintenance shop roof replacement was completed on August 12th.
- -<u>Clubhouse & Pro Shop Window Replacement & Repair</u>: The new, energy-efficient windows on both the clubhouse and golf pro shop buildings should be completed by the first week of September.
- -Millpond Park Parking Lot: The SSA has been working with Ensign Engineering, Blu Line Engineering, and Tooele County to complete the comprehensive design for Millpond Park. The ultimate design will include opening the amphitheater for live events and running the Tooele County shared walking trail along the greenspace. A start date won't be set until final approval is received from Tooele County.



UTAH OUTDOOR RECREATION GRANTS (UORG)


