

ORDINANCE NO. 84-6

AN ORDINANCE CHANGING THE NAME OF TOOELE
COUNTY SERVICE AREA NUMBER ONE AND
PROVIDING FOR THE ELECTION OF A BOARD OF
TRUSTEES FOR SAID SERVICE AREA.

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of
Tooele ordains as follows:

SECTION I - PURPOSE: This ordinance is for the purpose
of changing the name of "Tooele County Service Area Number One"
to "Stansbury Greenbelt Service Area of Tooele County."
Said name change is as a result of a formal request and
resolution made to the Board of Tooele County Commissioners
by the Board of Trustees of said Service Area for the purpose
of avoiding confusion of names and purposes with the Tooele
County Service Area Number Two. Said name change is not for
the purpose of defrauding creditors or any other purpose
contrary to law.

This ordinance is also for the purpose of providing for
an elective Board of Trustees for said Service Area as
requested by a duly filed petition of at least 10% of the
registered voters of said District.

SECTION II - NAME CHANGE: The corporate name of "Tooele
County Area Number One" as designated by Section II of
Tooele County Ordinance No. 81-17 is hereby changed and
amended and shall hereafter be known as "Stansbury Greenbelt
Service Area of Tooele County"; and that except for the

change of name, this Service Area shall be and remain vested with all rights, authority and privileges appertaining to this Service Area as was created by the Board of County Commissioners and as specified by Utah Law.

SECTION III - ELECTION OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES: It is hereby determined that the interests of the "Stansbury Greenbelt Service Area of Tooele County" will be best served by the election of its Board of Trustees, and therefore, Section VI of Ordinance No. 81-17 as amended by Ordinance No. 82-4 is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION VI - BOARD OF TRUSTEES: The Board of Commissioners of Tooele County shall initially appoint a Board of Trustees for said Service Area, consisting of three members, to serve for terms of two, four and six years, from the first Monday in January, 1983. After the initial appointment, except for appointments made to fill unexpired terms, all trustees of the Service Area shall be elected to six-year terms by the qualified voters of the Service Area as follows:

An election shall be held on the first Wednesday in December, 1984, for the appointed trustee whose term expires the first Monday in January, 1985. Thereafter, an election shall be held each succeeding two years on the first Wednesday in December next proceeding the expiration of the term of office of an incumbent trustee. Each trustee so subsequently elected shall serve for a term of six years and until his successor is elected.

SECTION V - EFFECTIVE DATE: In the opinion of the Board of County Commissioners, it is necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the County and the inhabitants thereof that this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon publication in one issue of a newspaper published in and having general circulation in Tooele County.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Board of County Commissioners of Tooele County has passed, approved and enacted this ordinance this 26 day of June, 1984.

AN ORDINANCE CHANGING THE NAME OF TOOELE

PROVIDING FOR THE ELECTION OF A BOARD OF
TRUSTEES FOR SAID SERVICE AREA.

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of
Tooele ordains as follows:

SECTION I - PURPOSE: This ordinance is for the purpose
of changing the name of "Tooele County Service Area Number Two"
to "Stansbury Recreation Service Area of Tooele County."
Said name change is as a result of a formal request and
resolution made to the Board of Tooele County Commissioners
