### Message From the GM, James Hanzelka

Stansbury Park is a wonderful place to live, despite the traffic issues. One thing that helps offset those challenges is residents' willingness to volunteer, particularly for efforts that fall somewhat outside the Agency's core mission. Over the years, we have relied on volunteers to lead activities, participate in cleanup efforts, share their expertise, or simply donate their time wherever help is needed. The library is largely supported by volunteers, and Stansbury Days would not happen without people willing to give their time. We have also relied on residents with specialized skills to assist with more technical work.

At this time of year, we begin planning for the year's events, and in the coming weeks, there will be calls for volunteers to assist with a variety of activities. Last year, the lake cleanup was an example of a highly anticipated event that could not be held due to a lack of volunteers. # PROJECT MANAGER UPDATE

- Millpond Park Phase 1
  - The Millpond Park Phase 1 project is at the 95<sup>th</sup> percentile of completion. The final step of this project is installing all the electrical components. After reviewing the project specifications with electrical engineers, we have decided to adjust the overall power supply load for the new main panel serving the area. The Agency is finalizing these details with the various entities involved in the project and expects to have this phase of development completed over the coming weeks.
- Sound Wall Trail
  - The Agency has been working with Tooele County and UDOT to develop this non-motorized shared-use trail that will connect Stansbury residents throughout the community for safe local transit. As UDOT and Tooele County have recently made their Master Plan official for a trail system that will stretch throughout Tooele County (and beyond in the future), we are in the final stages of planning and design to meet state requirements for the safety specifications for this trail. Because this trail has been mostly funded by a UDOT grant, the Agency is eager to finish this portion of the trail system by the end of the year and continue developing the rest as we secure appropriate funding.
- Oscarson Park
  - The Agency recently advertised for architectural & engineering services for the development of Oscarson Park. We received 10 offers from various firms and are working through deciding which firm best aligns with our goals for the park's needs. The Agency aims to understand the community's desires for Oscarson Park's uses and amenities through community outreach in order to design and develop the area appropriately.
- Arborist Contract
  - The Agency recently advertised for on-call arborists to sign on to a one-year contract to address various landscaping and arborist needs that cannot be handled in-house. Tooele County Roads has adopted a new policy effective February 5, 2026, and the Agency is working hand in hand to ensure safety issues and obstructions are addressed as quickly and appropriately as possible. We look forward to improving the aesthetics and safety of the community's greenery.
- Golf Pro Shop HVAC
  - The rooftop air conditioning unit at the golf shop is well past its useful life and requires a complete replacement. The Agency has been working closely with Wattsmart to take advantage of the incentivized rebates available for various energy conservation efforts in our buildings. We have also been working with various HVAC specialists to find the best solution to integrate into the existing system at the golf shop, keeping costs lower while still providing the necessary upgrades the building needs. The Agency also intends to reroof the section supporting the HVAC unit at the same time to streamline structural safety and energy conservation efforts.
